Owned by the husband and wife team of Kalen Trujillo Redmon and Kevin Redmon, Limon Verde is an Atlanta-based online jewelry boutique that specializes in unique, handcrafted, artisan pieces that are designed by Kalen. A native of Puerto Rico with a Columbian and Dominican background, Kalen has infused each piece with a bit of her heritage. Each piece is then crafted by artisans using the Filigrana Momposina (Mompox Filigree) technique of jewelry making, a method native to the town of Santa Cruz de Mompox, Columbia. The technique is the process of stretching, twisting and flattening a very high quality of strands of gold or silver in order to produce intricate, beautiful jewelry. Each piece is made with .980 silver, which yields a brilliantly shiny look.
